## Sports Premium Funding 2013 - 2014

**Background Information:** From September 2013 the Government allocated funding directly to primary schools to support and improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision. The 'Sports Premium' money is 'ring fenced' which means that it can only be used to help ensure that sport is at the heart of school life to improve participation and raise achievements for all young people. This funding will be available for three years until July 2016.

**Our Vision:** Our behaviour policy at St Albert's is based on the seven 'Olympic Values': Honesty, Respect, Determination, Equality, Courage, Excellence, Friendship and What Would Jesus Do? *We strive to incorporate these values into our daily life but think about them too during our PE lessons.*

- Provide more opportunities for Level 1 'Intra' tournaments
- Review of lunchtimes in the playground - Play Leaders - Increase Lunchtime Club provision e.g. cricket, speed stacking, rounders, cross country
- Increase after school sports club provision e.g. badminton, football, dance,
- Obtain 'Healthy Schools' status and 'Silver' School Games Award
